## **Reduction Print**

## Step One: Develop Design

- Develop an original design with three colors (white highlights +2 other colors).
- Use colored medium to map colors out (marker, colored pencil...)
- Check design with teacher.
- \*No generics (stereotypical images, cartoon images...)

## Step Two: Transfer Design and Cut

- Gather softcut linoleum and lino cutter from teacher.
- -Transfer image to linoleum with carbon paper. If you drew in pencil you can place your drawing upside down on your linoleum and press the back of the paper to transfer the pencil to the linoleum. After transfering trace your design lines with Sharpie.
- -Shade in the white areas first with a Sharpie.
- -Carefully cut out the areas that you shaded with Sharpie.

### Step Three: Printing

- -Gather paper to print onto. (3 white paper, 3 colored construction paper, newsprint, manilla paper, newspaper, magazine pages, tissue paper... You must print this first layer onto each paper because you cannot go back after you cut into the block again.)
- -Before printing you **MUST MAKE A REGISTER** so that all your prints will line up on top of one another. Find a larger scrap of posterboard from the scrap box (large enough to overlap the edges of your printing papers). Trace your printing paper onto the posterboard. Center your linoleum within the traced paper and trace the linoleum block.
- -Cover table area with newspaper before you begin printing. Gather plexiglass, brayer, and the lighter of your two ink colors. Use brayer to roll ink out evenly on the plexiglass. Roll brayer evenly across linoleum.
- -Center linoleum onto register (within traced shape), and then carefully line up paper over linoleum within the traced area on the register.
- -Apply even pressure across paper to pick up ink off of the linoleum block.
- -Write your initials as well as a number one on your first print (you will number each print sequentially as you print them).
- -Print this color on every paper that you have gathered to print onto. You are required to turn in one experimental print so try different color schemes on extra paper, printing in multiple directions, and

## Detailed Linoleum Block Print

- 1) The subject matter is of your choice, but the linoluem block cut out must be detailed like a drawing. Create a desig of your own. Do not copy someone elses work or idea. (Must be at least 5"x 7")
- 2) Complete a pla/drawing that is shaded using *cross-hatching* in pencil, pen, or marker. The cross hatching lines are what will be carved out on the linoleum.
- 3) Transfer your drawing to the linoleum block using the carbon transfer method or carbon paper.
- 4) Use linoleum cutting tools to carefully carve out your cross-hatching lines. Do a crayon rubbing of your design to se if it looks like you anticipated.
- 5) Pull prints on the following materials:
  - tissue paper alone and/or glued to other paper
  - newspaper
  - -different colors of construction paper
  - -magazine page, or collage of pages
- 6) 5 different prints will be turned in to be graded. Mat your favorite print.

- -Start with light areas (you can always make it darker)
- -Keep hand steady so points do not become "checks" or "lines"
- -Be sure to distinguish areas by value, not a "line of dots"
